- Over 300 highschool football players, in partnership with the Hamilton Tiger-Cats Highschool Mentorship program.
- 17 youth hockey players, in partnership with the Hamilton Bulldogs.
- Over 125 highschool students, by the Hamilton Tiger-Cats, in the classroom.
- 22 McMaster University Security Guards and coaches received enhanced training.
